Badgerland Dominoes

Introduction

This document provides you with up to three sets of dominoes.

The three sets are:

- **Ready-Coloured** - these can be used straight away
- **Colour Me In** - you colour these in, and then use them
- **Animal Dominoes** - these include pictures of some common wild animals found in the UK, and can be used straight away. You can also use them as the back for either the Ready-Coloured or the Colour Me In set.

The idea is that you print the relevant pages of this document in your printer (ideally in colour) and cut out the dominoes. *If you print this entire document, you will get **three** complete sets of dominoes.*

Setting Up Your Printer

- Set up your printer so that it is using a paper size of "A4 - portrait" or 210mm by 297mm.
- Make sure your printer is set to use a high-quality setting - ideally in colour.
- Use the heaviest paper you can. If you only have ordinary paper, make the dominoes stiffer, by sticking them to some thick cardboard (like an empty cereal packet or some heavy corrugated cardboard).

To make the Ready-Coloured dominoes

- Print pages 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of this document.
- Cut out the dominoes

To make the Colour Me In dominoes

- Print pages 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 of this document.
- Using felt-tip pens or coloured pencils, colour in the dominoes. Leave the dotted circles empty, but colour the complete circles in a really prominent colour.
- Cut out the dominoes

To make the Animal dominoes

- Print pages 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 of this document
- Cut out the dominoes

To make double-sided dominoes

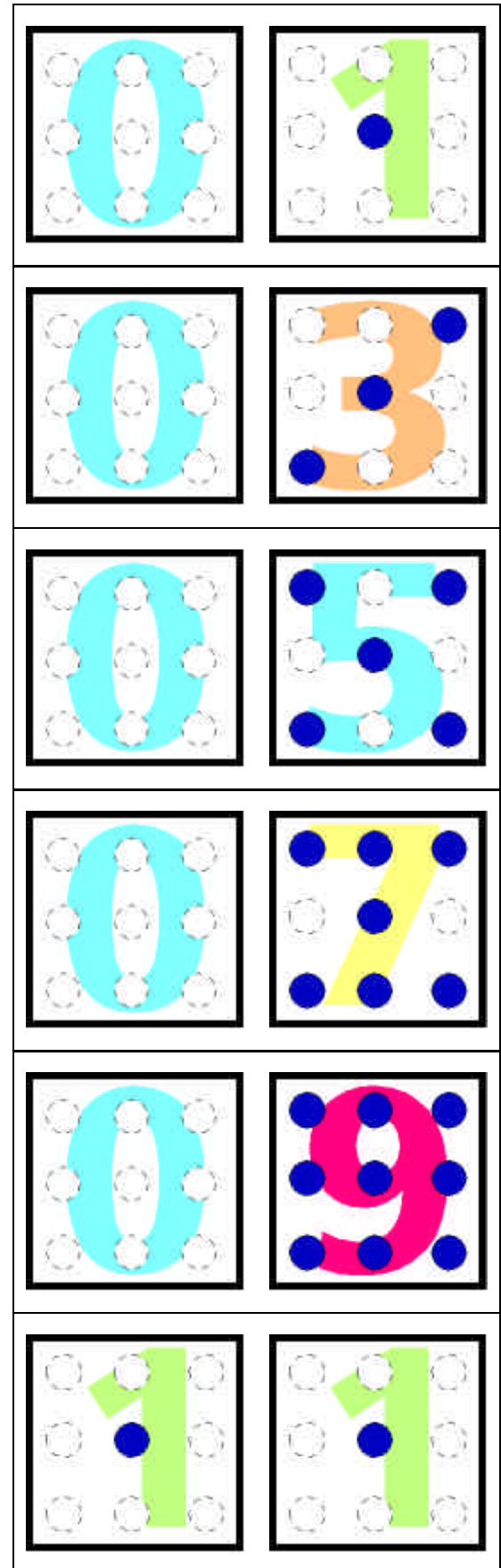
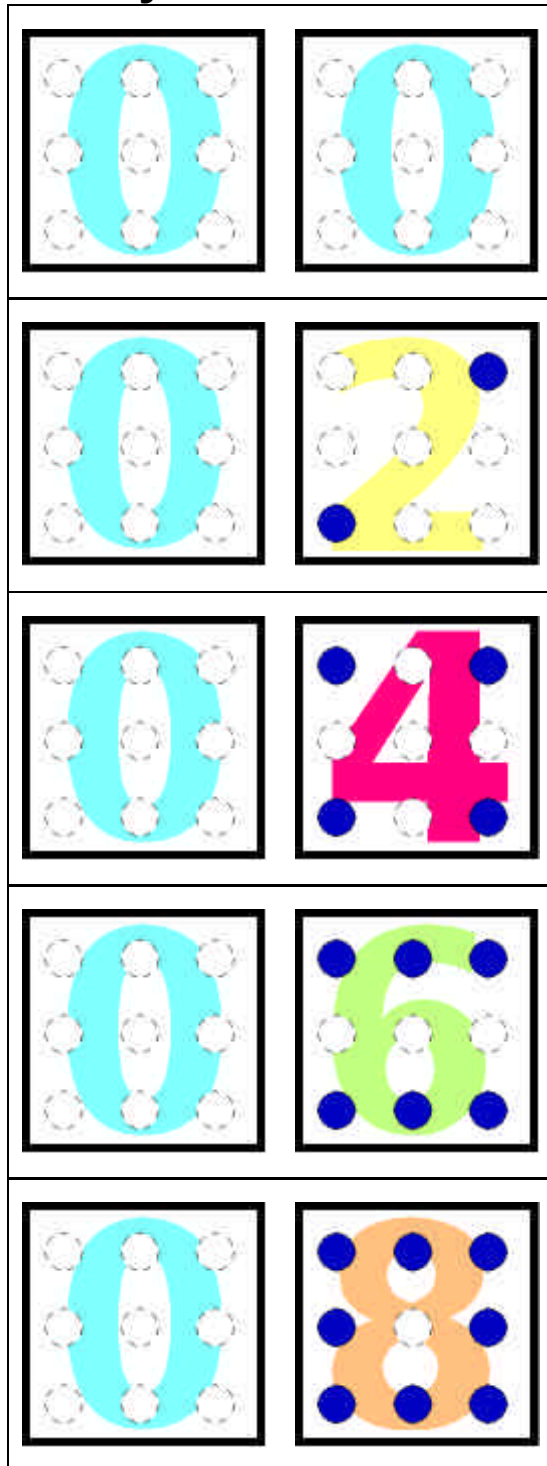
- Using really heavy paper:
- Print page 12 on the back of page 2 (or page 7)
- Print page 13 on the back of page 3 (or page 8)
- Print page 14 on the back of page 4 (or page 9)
- Print page 15 on the back of page 5 (or page 10)
- Print page 16 on the back of page 6 (or page 11)
- Cut out the dominoes

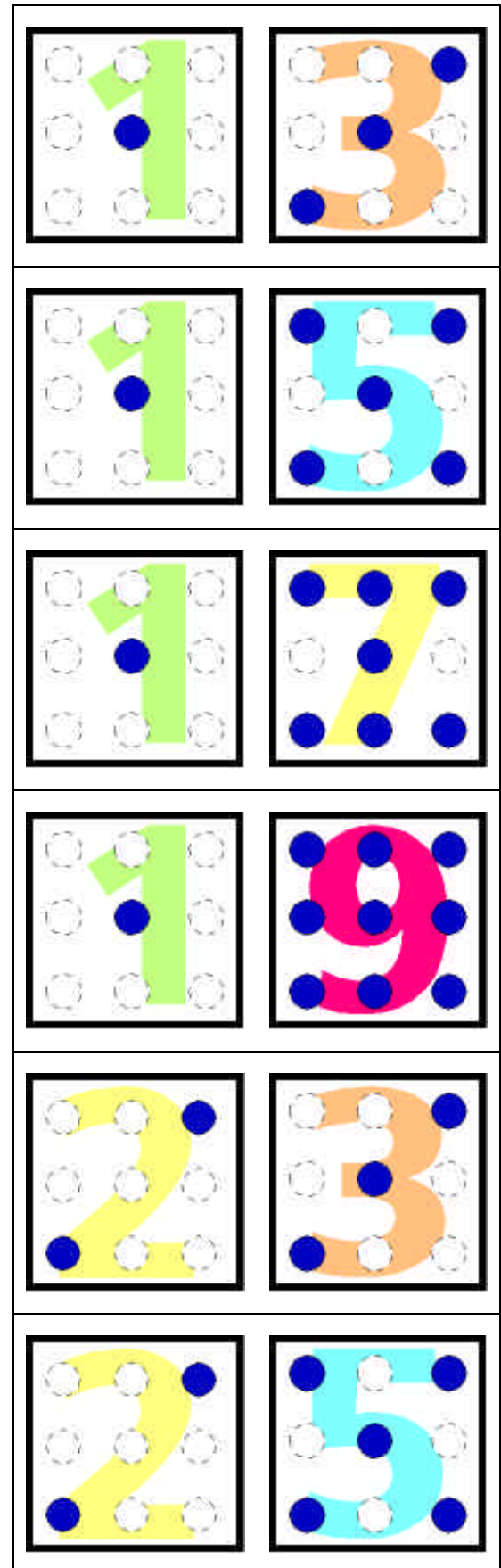
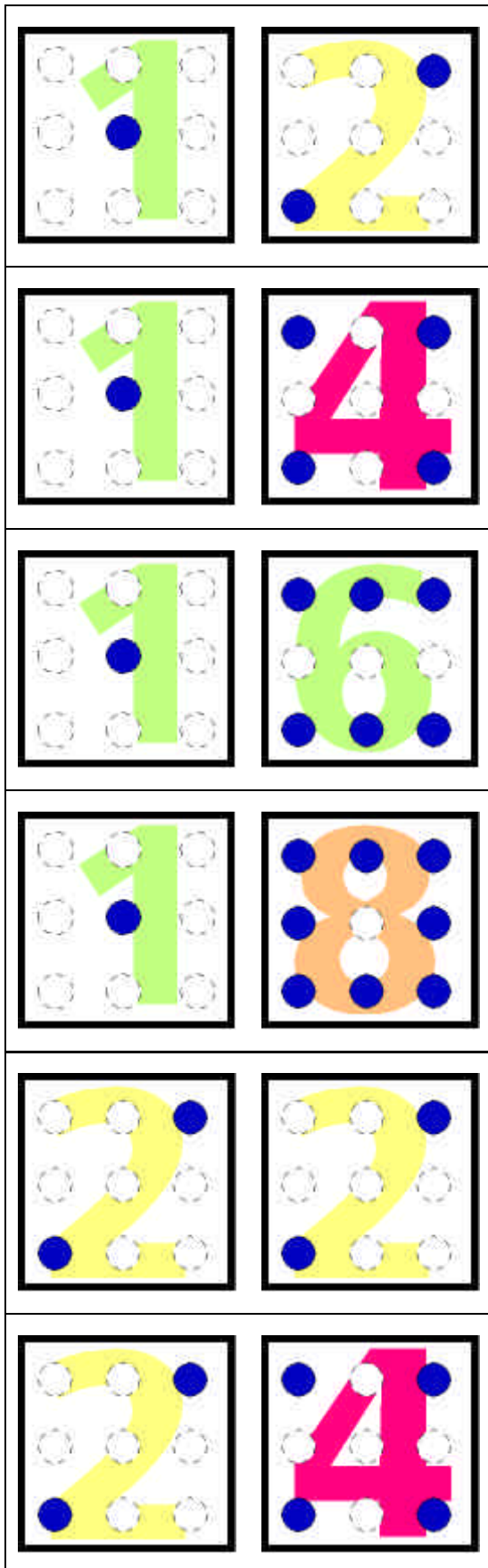

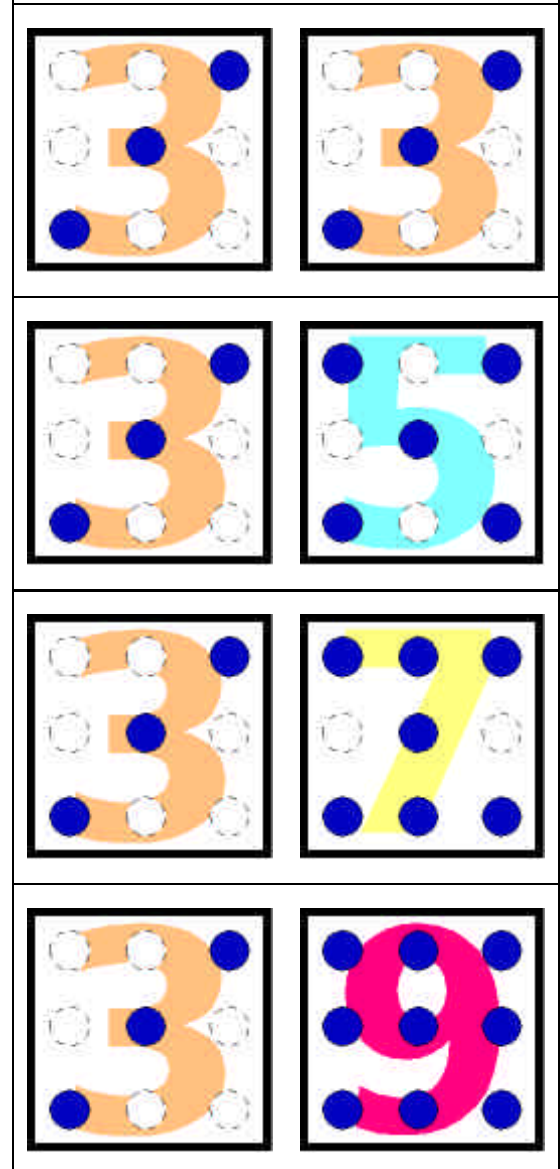
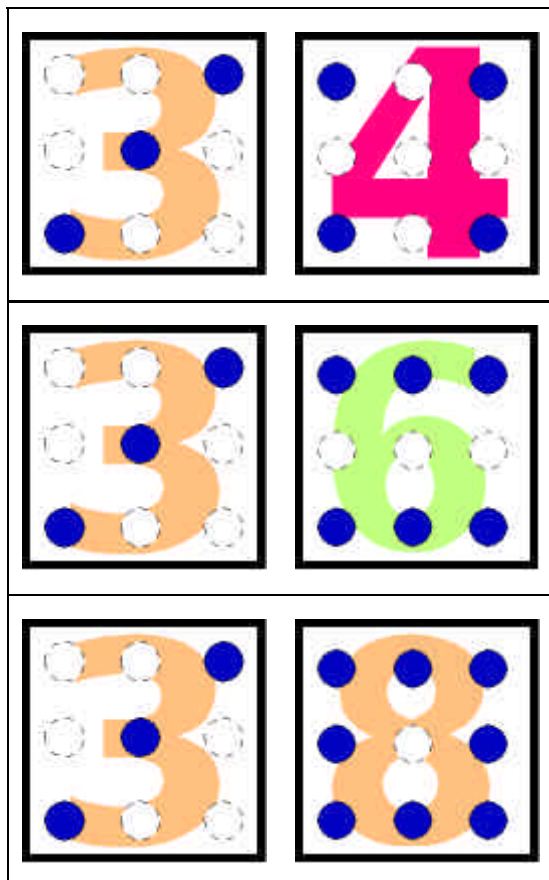
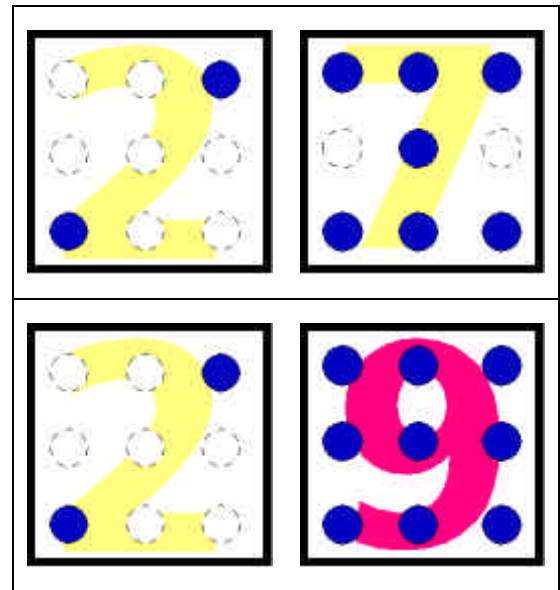
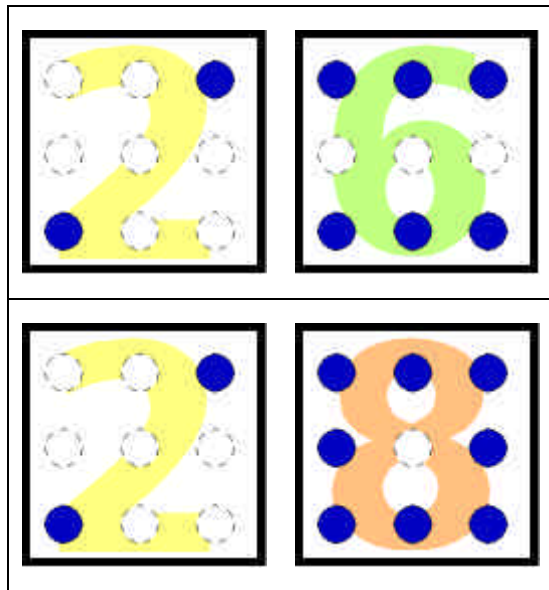
- Carefully cut out the dominoes, cutting just inside the dotted grey line. When you have finished, you should have 55 dominoes.

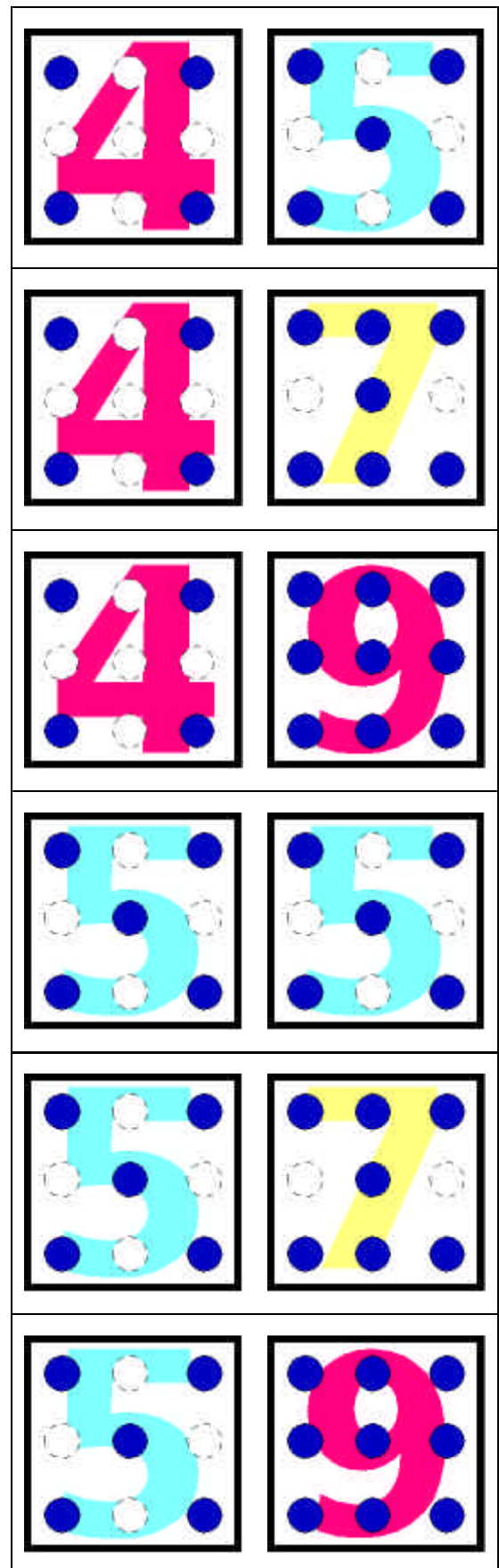
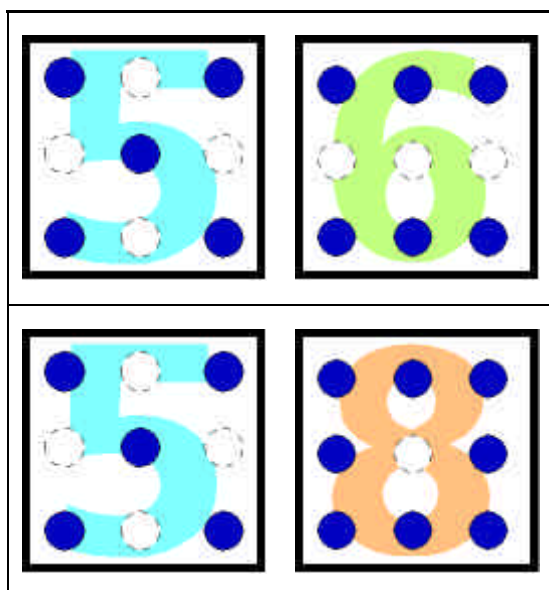
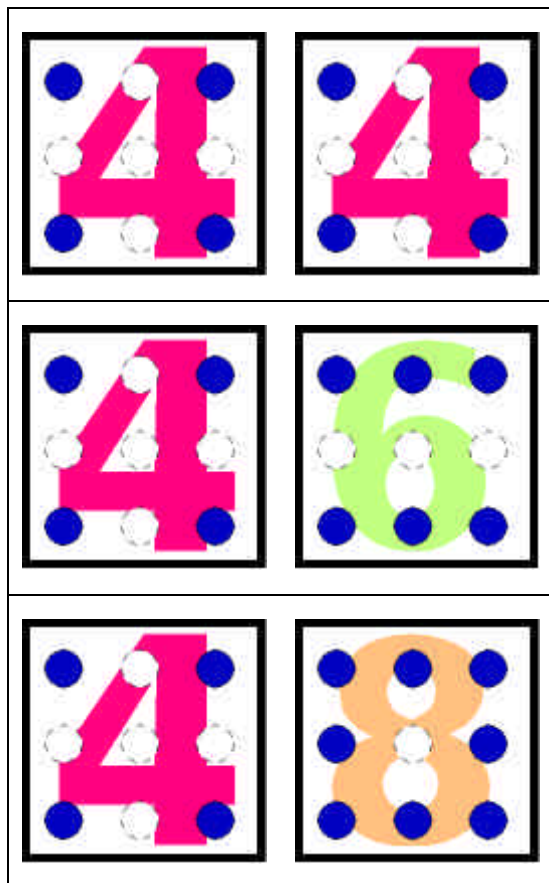


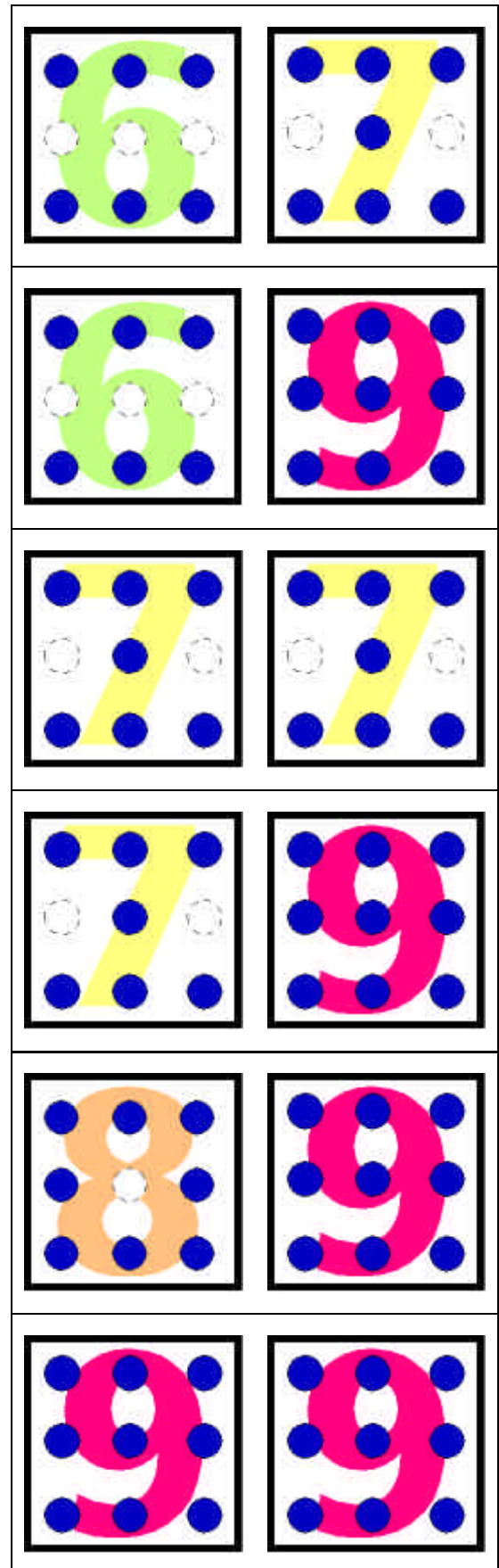
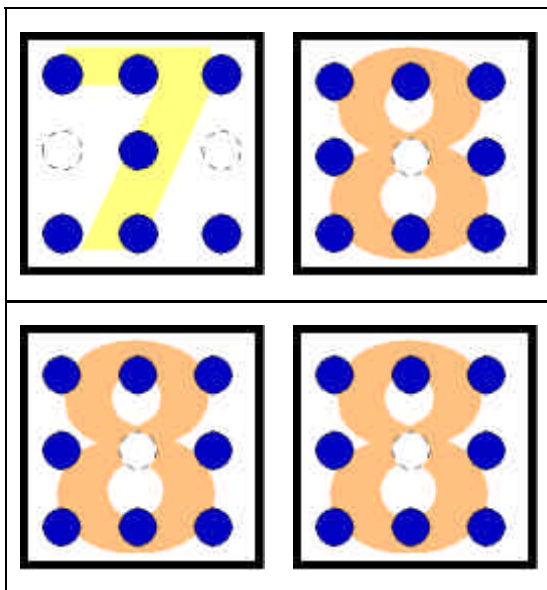
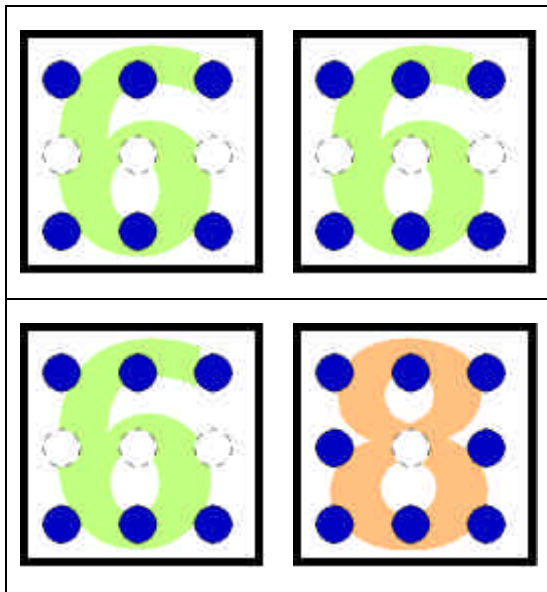
