

INSTRUCTIONS

You can use this document to make your own T-Shirt. Of course, if you really want to Buy a T-shirt with a picture of a badger on it, you can contact the National Federation of Badger Groups (NFBG) as they sell them in support of their own really good cause.

However, it can be fun to make your own t-shirt or get your own made.

You have two options:

- Print a picture onto an "iron-on" t-shirt label, and then iron the label on to your own t-shirt. You can
 normally buy "iron-on" t-shirt labels from decent computer supplies shops (like PC-World, Staples,
 Technomatic, Jungle, Misco, etc). They may sell their own-brand ones, or the good ones made by
 Avery.
- Alternatively, decide on a suitable picture, print a high-quality copy on good white paper, take it to a printing shop and get them to do the printing for you.



Badgers may be the oldest landowners in Britain.

They lived here, before Britain was an island.

They live in deciduous woodlands and copses.

Favourites are south-facing slopes near open pasture.

They grow up to 750mm from head to tail, and have
a 150mm tail. They can weigh up to 12kg.

Badgers groups (called clans) live in an underground sett.

The sett is lined with grass which is cleaned daily.

Badgers territories may occupy a square kilometre.

They have the teeth of a carnivore, but eat earthworms, insect pests, vermin, fruit, vegetables and carrion.


They are related to otters, polecats, weasels and pine martens.
